




3rd COVID Writing Competition "Impact" <u>Result</u>



You may recall that the One Health research cluster has been running COVID19 Writing competitions over the last two years. These competitions have provided a literary space for secondary students to appreciate the impact the COVID-19 pandemic had on their communities and families. In the past two completions, over 650 submissions have been received; all of which displayed a real passion for the subject. This year we will receive more than 250 submissions for the third, and very likely the last, writing competition on the pandemic. Future writing competitions will likely have a different epidemiological focus.

There were two themes to the competition – split between schools that follow the DSE curriculum and schools that follow the IB or other international curricula – that our Junior and Senior entrants could explore. The first was a Personal Reflection and the second was an Oral History.

In the Personal Reflection section, Junior and Senior students need to explore some questions with their own experience: How did COVID impact your life over the last three years? What was your life like before the pandemic? What is your life like now? In what ways has COVID had a lasting impact on who you are? In what ways do you think that your pre-COVID life will return once the pandemic recedes? Where do you go from here?

In the Oral History section, student participants need to talk with their family, friends, and people in their local community (teachers, people in their neighbourhood, clubs and societies) as an investigator. Then, write an oral history of the pandemic's social impacts over the last three years with these questions: How much of an impact has the pandemic had on their lives? How has their life changed since the start of the pandemic? How do they think Hong Kong has changed since the pandemic started? Are these good changes or bad changes or just changes? Do they think the changes will be permanent or will things shift back once the pandemic ends?

This year we received over 250 entries, a strong indicator of how much importance students and teachers placed on understanding these issues. The quality of writing again far exceeded expectations, with many writers displaying maturity and style well beyond their years. Although only sixteen prizes could be given, we also used a new award category, the Outstanding Writing Award, for those students whose work was among the best of the best.

The interest in the competition and the strength of the entries highlights the community interest in areas of One Health. It reinforces the need for City University and CLASS to continue reaching out beyond the campus to engage

with a wider range of voices in this area. It showcases the need to pursue One Health as a key strategic goal of the University across a range of pedagogical platforms. We thank all the students, their families, teachers and schools for the amazing support and interest shown in this year's One Health Writing Competition.

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
